

THE GOOD FIGHT CHURCH BACKGROUND & VISION

Initially a non-profit ministry focused on helping people overcome life-controlling problems through restoration groups, The Good Fight Ministry grew to 4 group locations with 6 meetings each week—over 600 people a month were seeking to restore their lives. Seeing a need for deeper discipleship to continue the growth people received through the restoration groups, The Good Fight Church (TGFC) was planted in February 2015. Driven by a desire to be His Hands and Feet as we daily take up our cross alongside each other, we are a fellowship under the headship of Jesus Christ, and we follow the leadership of the Holy Spirit in all phases of life. TGFC believes Christ is the center of life change and the local church is the hope of the world.

We aim to make disciples through Christ-centered worship, service, and community by focusing on the Head, Hands, and Heart. The Head is all about Jesus, the Hands direct our focus to embodying Christ's character in our community, and the Heart centers on each of us allowing God to restore even our deepest wounds. We're not looking for a momentary sensation, but a lifetime of authentic healing in a growing community of support and accountability—a legacy of Kingdom-building that outlasts us all.

COVENANT MEMBERSHIP

Covenant Membership is about committing to a spiritual family that provides encouragement and support. That family is called to a biblical degree of responsibility, service, and sacrifice. The leadership of TGFC pledge to assist our Covenant Members with care, counsel, prayer, and discipleship. Accountability is at the center of membership—we are a family. We love and honor each other. We roll up our sleeves and dig deep. We're honest about our dirt and the restorative process by which He makes our hearts new. We are being pruned alongside each other, we grow, and we bear fruit in Him. We don't turn away from each other when the storms come; we find refuge in Him while we stay in the boat—together. We set ourselves at His Feet and embrace His Truth and Love. This is the covenant we share.

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THE GOOD FIGHT CHURCH MISSION & VISION

Mission

To make disciples through Christ-centered worship, service, and community.

Vision

To focus on the Head, the Hands, and the Heart.

What is Worship?

Worship is constant in all aspects of our lives. Each of our thoughts, words, desires, and actions are our opportunities to glorify God. Worship is not just done on Sundays at a church building, but in every moment we have. 1 Corinthians 10:31, Colossians 3:17

What is Service?

The church is not meant to go inward, but outward. As the body of Christ, we must emulate what Christ did and humble ourselves to serve others. **John 13:15-16, Titus 3:14**

What is Community?

We worship a Triune God which is the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. We recognize this as communal. Since we are created in His image, we are called to reflect this community. Christianity is not a religion but a personal relationship with Jesus that is meant to be shared with the world. This means to be Christian, we must have a relationship with God and with others. The local church is not a place to attend but a place to belong. This is the context for discipleship. We have three main types of community: Academic Groups, Restoration Groups, and Connection Groups. These communities help us focus on healing the wounded heart. Acts 2:42-47, Hebrews 3:12-13, 1 Corinthians 12:12-31, Romans 15:6

What does the Head mean in our vision?

We believe that Jesus is the Head of our Church. Focusing on the Head is all about knowing who Jesus is. In order to know Jesus, we must believe He is Who He says He is. We can do this through discipleship, particularly by providing and seeking out healthy learning environments. This can be Bible studies, book studies, or any environment that helps strengthen our knowledge of Christ and grow in an academic arena.

What do the Hands mean in our vision?

The Hands refer to the people. <u>The church is not a building but the people inside of it</u>. It all starts with a relationship with Jesus and relationships with others. This form of discipleship can be done with connection groups, outreach, and anything that helps strengthen our relationship with Jesus and others. The Hands compliment the head by being the action behind our knowledge of Who Jesus is.

What does the Heart mean in our vision?

We believe in total depravity, which is Man's natural condition apart from the grace given by God that redeems us. Because of the fall of Man, we are born into sin. This being our natural state, we all have a wounded heart at some level. When we accept Jesus into our hearts, we no longer are held captive by our sin; however, our heart (although redeemed) has been wounded from our past. The "Heart" part of our vision is all about restoring our hearts so we may guard our transformation and not let the wounds of our past creep back into our lives. This form of discipleship can be done through Restoration Groups at TGFC. These groups are a systematic approach to the sanctification God desires for our lives. When we can overcome our past wounds, our emotional and spiritual lives have a larger capacity to grow.

THE GOOD FIGHT CHURCH BELIEFS

Statement of Basic Beliefs

The Gospel is the hope of the world. As we read the Scriptures, we see the overarching themes of God's providence, power, and provision to reconcile mankind and the created world to Himself through the person and work of Jesus Christ. In light of this, we aim to be explicitly Gospel-centered in all that we preach, teach, and practice.

The Bible

We believe the Bible is the inerrant Word of God, divinely inspired in its original words, containing all that there is to know concerning the nature and character of God, the sinfulness of man, and the plan of redemption God has revealed in His Son, Jesus Christ. **2 Timothy 3:16**

The Trinity

We believe and teach that there is but one living and true God (Deuteronomy 6:4; Isaiah 45:5-7; 1 Corinthians 8:6), an infinite, all-knowing Spirit (John 4:24), perfect in all His attributes, one in essence, eternally existing in three Persons—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit (John 3:16, Matthew 28:19; 2 Corinthians 13:14)—each equally deserving worship and obedience.

Salvation

We understand that salvation is wholly of God by grace on the basis of the redemption of Jesus Christ, the merit of His shed blood, and not on the basis of human merit or works. **John 1:12; Ephesians 1:7;** 2:8-9; 1 Peter 1:18-19

The Holy Spirit

We teach that it is the work of the Holy Spirit to execute the divine will with relation to all mankind. We recognize His sovereign activity in creation (**Genesis 1:2**), the incarnation (**Matthew 1:18**), the written revelation (**2 Peter 1:20-21**), and the work of salvation (**John 3:5-6**, **Acts 1:5**).

Baptism

Baptism is symbolic of the death, burial, and resurrection of Christ. Once we have accepted Jesus as our Lord and Savior, baptism is a way for us to publicly declare our new life in Christ. It is also an act of obedience based on God's commands and allows us to follow the example of Jesus, who submitted Himself to baptism to "fulfill all righteousness." Matthew 3:16-17, 28:18-20, Acts 2:41, 8:12

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CORE VALUES

- We will be authentic. Healing only begins when we remove the masks.
- We will live by example. You may be the only bible someone ever reads.
- We will step out in faith and out of our comfort zone. God will grow us when we listen and obey.
- We will be teachable and coachable. If you're not swimming, you're sinking. There is always room for growth.
- We will help with excellence. Excellence honors God and inspires others.
- We will do our part for the kingdom. We will go bankrupt if we consume more than we contribute.
- We give from our heart. Time and money are better placed when you have a desire and not because you have to.
- We will love God and people. Without these two, we don't have anything.
- We will make tough decisions when called. Sometimes we will have to hurt immediately in order not to harm permanently.
- We will never shy away from the Truth. A lot has changed in 2000 years, but Jesus is not one of them.
- We are stronger as a family. Jesus surrounded Himself in community and we will follow His lead!

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THE GOOD FIGHT CHURCH COVENANT MEMBERSHIP OVERVIEW

The Good Fight Church Covenant Church Membership Guidelines

Any person may offer himself/herself for membership at TGFC. After meeting the guidelines outlined by the TGFC covenant membership, the person will be a covenant member of TGFC.

Covenant Memberships Primary Functions

TGFC covenant is created out of our love for the church body and its individual members whom we hope will experience the fullness of joy which is found in the presence of Christ. The primary purpose of this covenant is to serve as a teaching document with these functions:

- To clarify the biblical obligations and expectations for both the leadership team of TGFC and the individual members of TGFC
- To have a clear statement of our beliefs
- To serve as a tool for reflection and growth toward our mission and vision
- To serve as a launching point for each member's spiritual and emotional growth
- A pledge to be a functioning member of the body

Guidelines for Covenant Membership at The Good Fight Church

- By profession of faith, followed with baptism
- Attend the covenant membership class for knowledge of beliefs, mission, and vision of the church
- Regular, consistent attendance
- Giving, including tithing and contribution of time (Matthew 6:19-23)

What is a covenant?

A covenant is generally defined as a "written agreement or promise, usually under seal between two or more parties, especially for the performance of some action" (Merriam-Webster). The Bible speaks of formal relationships inside the local church and uses the concept of a covenant. Within the Scriptures, we find a number of examples of covenants, some between God and man (Genesis 6, 9, 15; Ezekiel 20; Hosea 2; Jeremiah 31; Matthew 26), while others are solely between men (1 Samuel 18:3, 2 Samuel 5:3). In covenants, the parties bind together to fulfill the purposes, goals, and obligations of the agreement.

Why Membership?

The local church is more than a place or building. The Church is the gathering of the redeemed, the sanctified flock of the Shepherd, the united house of God, the body and bride of Christ, set apart to glorify God in all we do (**Ephesians 3:10**). Commitment of believers to one another is not to be taken lightly. Throughout the Bible, there are profound relationships that exist among those who have been reconciled to God and each other.

The Scriptures call us to love, live in harmony, instruct, greet, comfort, serve, bear the burdens of, forgive, encourage, always seek to do good to, exhort, stir up to love and good works, confess our sins, pray with and for, and show hospitality to one another.

Since inception, the Church universal has been arranged into smaller congregations—this is the local church. Christians believe local churches are essential communities instituted by God for His Glory and our good.

In 1 Corinthians 12, Paul draws on the imagery of a body as a metaphor for the local church. Not seeming self-sufficient and independent, the apostle upholds a radically countercultural vision of desperate interdependence marked by love, service, humility, and sacrifice.

Membership is not about privilege or prestige. It's not about an inner circle with grander visions of secrets within the church. It's not a legal document or means of control. It is not an approval process to choose and not choose who is a part of the church. It is a guideline for the body of believers, a way to have accountability, and a commitment to the mission and vision of the church. It recognizes and responds to the call of discipleship in the context of community. Having Covenant Membership status is not about perks or privileges. It is about being accountable to the local church and it being accountable to its members. Membership is about strengthening the body of Christ by being the body of Christ.

Christians commit themselves to each other in the context of the local church in many ways. At TGFC, the current guidelines for membership are outlined under "Guidelines for Covenant Membership at The Good Fight Church" on page 4.

Conclusion

God calls His people into covenant, not only to Himself but also to each other. He calls us to a life of sacrifice, generosity, service, and radical commitment to the Good of the body. This obligation is best pursued within the context of a particular body—a local church. In light of this reality, membership is not merely a responsibility, but an opportunity to be in covenant with a particular people to live out the Gospel together. It is a pledge to be a part of this local church body and to be accountable as functioning members of such body.

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ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. Scriptures

The Bible was written by men divinely inspired and is the record of God's revelation of Himself to man. It's a perfect treasure of divine instruction. It has God for its author, salvation for its end, and truth, without any mixture of errors, for its matter. It is inerrant and infallible in its original manuscript, which is to be taken as verbally inspired. It reveals the principles by which God judges us; therefore, it is and will remain, to the end of the world, the true center of Christian union and the supreme standard by which all human conduct, creeds, and religious opinions should be tried. The criterion by which the Bible is to be interpreted is Jesus Christ. **Romans 15:4, 2 Timothy 3:14-17**

2. God

God is the only One living and true God, whose subsistence is in and of Himself; infinite and perfect, His essence cannot by comprehended by any but Himself. The most pure Spirit, He never changes and is immense, eternal, incomprehensible, all powerful, most holy, all wise, completely free and absolute, all loving, gracious, merciful, long suffering, abundant in goodness and truth, forgiving sin, but also just in His judgments, and hating all sin. We further believe that the one true God is triune, eternally existing in three persons—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—co-eternal in being, co-identical in nature, coequal in power and glory, and having the same attributes and perfections. **Genesis 1, John 1:1-5, Revelation 1:8**

a. God the Father

God as Father reigns with providential care over His universe, His creatures, and the flow of the stream of human history according to the purposes of His grace. God is Father in truth to those who become children of God through faith in Jesus Christ. **Deuteronomy 6:4, Isaiah 45:5-7, 1 Corinthians 8:6**

b. God the Son

Christ is the only eternally begotten Son of God the Father. In His incarnation as Jesus Christ, He was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, and truly became man without ceasing to be God. He perfectly revealed and did the will of God, taking upon Himself the demands and necessities of human nature and identifying Himself completely with mankind (but was without sin). He honored the divine by His personal obedience, and in His death on the cross He made provision for the redemption of men from sin. He was raised from the dead with a glorified body and appeared to His disciples as the Person who was with them before His crucifixion. He ascended into Heaven and is now exalted at the right hand of God where He is the One Mediator, being of the nature of God and of man, and in whose Person is effected the reconciliation between God and man. He will return in power and glory to judge the world and to consummate His redemptive mission. He now dwells in all believers as the living and ever present Lord. Matthew 16:16-17, John 1:14, John 3:16, Acts 1:9, 1 John 5:12

c. God the Holy Spirit

The Holy Spirit is the Spirit of God, eternally proceeding from the Father and the Son. Through Him, man was enabled to understand truth. He exalts Christ. He convicts of sin and judgment, and leads to righteousness. He calls men to the Savior, and effects regeneration. He cultivates Christian character, comforts believers, and bestows the spiritual gifts by which they serve God through His church. The purpose of spiritual gifts is to edify the church, and He distributes to each believer sovereignty as He wills. The Holy Spirit hears and answers the prayer of faith for the sick and the afflicted when it is in accordance with His will, although it is not always His will to heal the infirmity, as in the case of the apostle Paul. The Holy Spirit also seals the believer unto the day of final redemption. His presence in the Christian is the assurance of God to bring the believer into the fullness of Christ. He enlightens and empowers believers and the church in worship, evangelism, and service. **Genesis 1:2, Acts 1:5, 1 Corinthians 2:12-13, 2 Peter 1:20-21**

3. Man

Man was created by God in His own image, and is the crowning work of His creation. In the beginning, man was innocent of sin and was endowed by His Creator with freedom of choice. By this free will, man sinned against God and brought sin into the human race. Through the temptation of Satan, Adam transgressed the command of God and fell from his original innocence; in this sin, all the human race fell, inherited a sinful nature, and became alienated from God. Man is totally depraved, inclined to sin, and, of himself, utterly unable to remedy his lost condition. Only the grace of God can bring man into His fellowship and enable man to do His will as revealed in the Word. The sacredness of human personality is evident in that God created man in His own image, and in that Christ died for man; therefore, every man possesses dignity and is worthy of respect and Christian love. Genesis 1:26-27, Genesis 1:31, Genesis 3:4-6, Matthew 22:39, Romans 3:23-24, 1 John 3:11, 1 John 4:20-21, 1 John 5:12

4. Salvation

Salvation involves the redemption of man and is offered freely to all who accept Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior, who by His own blood obtained eternal redemption for the believer. In its broadest sense, salvation includes regeneration, sanctification, and glorification. **1 John 5:5**

a. Regeneration

Regeneration, or the new birth, is a work of God's grace whereby believers become new in Christ Jesus. It is the beginning of a new, divine life brought by the Holy Spirit through conviction of sin, to which the sinner responds in repentance toward God and faith in Jesus Christ.

Repentance and faith are inseparable experiences of grace. Repentance as presented in the scriptures is a genuine turning from sin toward God. Faith is the acceptance of Jesus Christ and commitment of the person to recognize Him as the living Lord and Savior. Justification is God's gracious and full acquittal upon principles of His righteousness of all sinners who repent and believe in Christ. Having been justified, the believer has peace with God through Jesus Christ and is adopted into a position of an ambassador for God. **2 Corinthians 5**, **Romans 6:1-7**

b. Sanctification

Sanctification is the experience, beginning in regeneration, by which the believer is set apart to God's purposes, and is enabled to progress toward moral and spiritual perfection through the presence and power of the Holy Spirit. We will never achieve perfection in this life due to the fall of man. Romans 8:28-30, Romans 12:2, Colossians 3:1-18, 1 Thessalonians 5:23

c. Glorification

Glorification is the culmination of salvation and is the final blessed and abiding state of the redeemed. **Romans 8:30**

5. God's Purpose of Grace

Grace is a gift from God, according to which He regenerates, sanctifies, and glorifies sinners. It is a glorious display of God's sovereign goodness, and is infinitely unchangeable. It excludes boasting and promotes humility.

All true believers endure to the end. Those whom God has accepted in Christ and sanctified by His Spirit will never fall away from the state of grace, but shall persevere to the end. Acts 20:24, Ephesians 2, Romans 3:23-24, 2 Timothy 4:7

6. The Church

A New Testament church of Jesus Christ is a local body of believers who are associated by covenant in the faith and fellowship of the gospel, observing the two ordinances of Christ (baptism and communion), committed to His teachings, exercising the gifts, and invested in by His Word. Its twofold responsibility is to edify its members through the teaching of the Word and to seek to extend the gospel to the ends of the earth.

TGFC is an autonomous body dedicated to the discernment and execution of the Will of Christ. Members will share the responsibility to make the twofold enactments come to fruition. It is understood that the church will act only when the Will of Christ has been discerned. The discernment will emerge primarily through a study of the Scriptures and prayer; practical wisdom may also be a guide but is secondary to the Scriptures and prayer. God has also placed Pastors and Leaders in the church to aid in the discernment and execution of Christ's Will.

The mission of the church universal is to glorify God by making disciples through the gospel. God's mission and the mission of His church are inseparably linked. If God's mission is to be glorified through the redemption and reconciliation of a people, the Church's mission must orient around the glory of God and seek to glorify Him through redemption and reconciliation. Acts 1:8, Acts 2:38, Acts 2:42-44, 1 Corinthians 11:23-26, 2 Corinthians 5, Ephesians 4:16, Hebrews 10:19-25

7. Baptism

Baptism is the immersion of a believer in water in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. It is an act of obedience symbolizing the believer's faith in a crucified, buried, and risen Savior, the believer's death to sin, the burial of the old life, and the resurrection to new life in Christ Jesus. This is the next step after believing and professing that Jesus is the Messiah. **Matthew 3:13-17, Acts 1:5, Acts 2:38-41**

8. Communion

As with water baptism, Communion is to be observed only by those who have become genuine followers of Christ. This ordinance symbolizes the breaking of Christ's body and the shedding of His blood on our behalf and is to be observed repeatedly throughout the Christian life as a sign of continued participation in the atoning benefits of Christ's death. As we come to the table with an attitude of faith and self-examination, we remember and proclaim the death of Christ, receive spiritual nourishment for our souls, and signify our unity with other members of Christ's body. Luke 22:14-23, John 6:53-58, 1 Corinthians 11:23-26

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GOVERNING BODY

The Good Fight Church recognizes Jesus Christ as the head of our church, the Holy Spirit as our source of power, and Scripture as the infallible guide in all matters of doctrine, faith, church order, and discipline.

The government of The Good Fight Church is vested in the body of believers who compose it. Persons duly received by the members shall constitute the membership. Every member has a voice in church plans, government, and discipline. The organizational structure consists of the following:

Church Leadership Team (CLT) reports to the Lead Pastor of TGFC. The CLT is responsible for overseeing the mission and vision of the church. They help with stewarding church resources and the overall health of the church. **1 Peter 5:1-6**

Pastors and Staff are charged with carrying out the mission and vision of the church. The Lead Pastor preaches on a weekly basis and stewards staff members, leaders, volunteers, and people within the church. Staff members and full time volunteers will assist the Pastors with carrying out the mission and vision of TGFC, as well as anything operationally for the church.

Deacons act as stewards for Volunteer Leaders and minister to people within the church. Their responsibilities consist of overseeing the people within the church. They steward the health of the people by assisting them in getting where God has called them to be. Deacons help walk people through life struggles by directing them to the best solution. **1 Timothy 3:8-13**

Volunteer Leaders are people within the church who serve the church on a consistent basis. Volunteer leaders are background-checked, serve in one or more ministries, and are ambassadors of TGFC. These servant-leaders put the needs of TGFC and others first. Volunteer Leaders report to the Staff and the CLT.

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EXPECTATIONS FOR CHURCH MEMBERS AND LEADERS

- We will strive to be a direct reflection of Christ and a representative of His church.
- We will love God and others with the same love Christ shows His church. Matthew
 22:37
- As representatives of the Church, We will not post inappropriate messages on social media. This includes bad language, insinuating sexual undertones, or anything that could draw negative attention to God's church or followers of His Truth. **James 1:18-21**
- We are to be above reproach and a good steward. Titus 1:6-7, 1 Timothy 3:2, Philippians 2:15
- We will have attitudes that reflect Christ. That doesn't mean we aren't allowed to have a bad day, but does mean we will try to emulate Christ with our actions and words. Philippians 2:1-2
- Be humble, take interest in and build up others in the church, and treat them as you would like to be treated. **Luke 6:31, Philippians 2:3-4**
- Gossip, lying, anger, and talk that is hurtful to others is not tolerated. Ephesians 4:29, Ephesians 5:4, Colossians 3:8-10, James 3:1-18, Colossians 4:6, Proverbs 19:11, Ecclesiastes 7:9

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GROUPS

Why do our Groups exist?

The purpose of getting plugged in to a group can be summed up in one simple word: relationships. God created us to live in relationship with others, and only then can we live the full life He intends for us. Sharing life through community is part of our design, but healthy, meaningful relationships aren't always easy to find. That's why our groups exist—to make these life-changing relationships relevant and accessible to you.

What are our Groups about?

Our groups are an intentional gathering of people where you can connect with others on a regular basis. They may share your interests, be at a similar stage in life, or have experience in an area where you would like coaching.

- Academic Groups: Offer discipleship through a learning environment. Through studying books of the Bible or non-fiction literature, these groups deepen our understanding of God's Character, His purposes, and who He calls us to be, thereby enhancing our walk with Christ.
- Connection Groups: People within the church doing life together. They offer opportunities to connect with like-minded believers who share common interests.
- Restoration Groups: Created for everyone, these form the foundation of our discipleship groups. They encourage individuals to apply a systematic healing process that encourages us to pursue the freedom and hope God intended for us all by overcoming painful obstacles that limit or prevent restoration in our lives. Restoration Groups promote growth and help us achieve healing, teach us how to develop and strengthen our relationship with Christ, and equip us with necessary tools to disciple someone else to do the same.

How do you find a Group?

- Attend Restoration Groups which meet regularly at TGFC
- Engage with others at weekly services
- Ask a volunteer leader, especially if you have a specific need/desire
- Look on the TGFC website: www.thegoodfight.church/groups
- Look on the "Groups" wall in the church building or Welcome Center
- Receive an invitation from someone in a Group at The Good Fight Church

How do you become a Group Leader?

- A leader must be a believer
- Must have been baptized
- Must be a church member
- Must complete a group leader application
- Must be background check approved
- Must complete an interview with a Staff Member
- Must complete Groups Leader Training

Further Requirements

- Adhere to the "Expectations for Church Members and Leaders" (p 10)
- Provide a location for their group to meet
- Recruit people to the group

GIVING

We serve a giving God. There is nothing more apparent in Scripture than the generosity, grace, and gifts of God. He delights in giving.

Since we are created in His image, strive to be Christ like, and are continually working on conforming to Him, we should delight in giving as He does.

TGFC believes the Bible teaches the tithe as 10%, but we encourage our members to embark in the life we are called to live in a generous manner. By giving, we have an opportunity to proclaim who He is through our generosity by what we can give. Giving energizes our devotion to Christ and frees us from consuming more than we contribute. Generosity is the best way to avoid falling prey to lust of the eyes, and the best way to overcome this is to give wholeheartedly. It provides a way for us to proclaim His sufficiency and provision. If we are to have faith, then we must give faithfully and generously.

As we take part in this chance of giving, here are a few principles to consider:

- **Give Generously:** Consider **2 Corinthians 8-9**. If you want to grasp giving, read those entire chapters thoroughly. This will show radical giving, not just mandated giving.
- **Give Cheerfully:** Give because you want to, not because you will be rewarded. The heart must be free from the lust for appearance. (**Matthew 6:1-4**)
- **Give Sacrificially:** This is the hardest type of giving today because it is inconvenient. The flesh offers excuses and justification on why we shouldn't, but the Gospel says to do otherwise. In **1 John 3:16-17**, the apostle exhorts the Church to care for brothers in need as an overflow and implication of Gospel love, the type of love that lays down one's life for another. Do we actually give to the point that we feel it and the feeling stings? Does the call to take up our cross (**Matthew 16:24-26**) not also carry the charge to lay down our checkbooks, schedules, and self-serving desires?
- **Give Spontaneously:** A heart freed doesn't wait for opportunities to give; it seeks them out intentionally. This is more about blessing others and obedience. Those walking in His light engage in good deeds and meet pressing needs anytime and anywhere they arise.
- **Give Regularly:** Though we should give as need arises, we should also be consistent and disciplined in giving. Giving is linked with prayer and fasting (**Matthew 6:1-18**), and both should contain some element of discipline and regularity. In **1 Corinthians 16:2**, Paul explicitly commends a disciplined and orderly form of giving in addition to whatever spontaneous offerings and gifts we might be compelled to give.
- **Give Secretly:** Jesus doesn't necessarily intend for us to be completely anonymous, but there's a general theme of secret giving for the sake of eternal reward. The flesh craves the praise of man, and thus we need to beware the hypocrisy and tendency to give in an effort to gain notoriety from others. (**Matthew 6:2-4**)
- **Give Thankfully:** Grace is the basis for gratitude. As people who have received grace, we should gratefully extend it to others.

Giving is not designated only to the church; rather, in all areas of our lives, we are to give generously.

- Leading Groups: As a member, you will be able to lead Connection, Restoration, and Academic Groups as approved. If you are interested in leading a Connection Group, submit your idea online at http://thegoodfight.church/connection. For Academic Groups and Restoration Groups, contact the Family and Discipleship Pastor.
- Scheduled Use of Building: This building belongs to the Church. As members, you are the Church. If you have an event you would like to use the building for, contact the Administrative Assistant for scheduling. Use of the building is on a first-come, first-served basis and must not conflict with any church group meeting times. When you use the building, you may also use any tables, chairs, and drink dispensers available. You are responsible for the facilities, set-up, break-down, and supplies of The Good Fight Church.
- Accountability and Support: The Good Fight Church is here to support its members as needed. We offer benevolence, food trains, counseling, and accountability to those who are in need.
